
Love the planet

Recipe - Baked Veg

Ingredients

Green beans - 50 gm
Carrot - 50 gm
Corn kernels - 50 gm
Onion - 50 gm
Capsicum - 50 gm
Broccoli - 50 gm
Cheese cubes - 2



For white Sauce

4 teaspoon butter
2 teaspoon wheat flour
2 cups milk
Salt to taste.

Process

Preparation for the vegetables

1. Finely chop all the vegetables.
2. Other than capsicum blanch all the vegetables (after adding salt) and keep aside.

Preparation for the white sauce

1. Heat butter in a pan.
2. Add wheat flour and stir for a min.
3. Add lukewarm milk to it and stir continuously until gets thick (2- 3 mins) add salt and turn off the flame. The sauce is ready.

Baking Process

1. Preheat the oven.
2. Mix the blanched vegetables, capsicum, and white sauce.
3. Place the mixture in a baking tray evenly.
4. Grate 2 cheese cubes over it and sprinkle mixed herbs (optional) over it.
5. Bake it for 15 mins under convection mode (180 degrees) or till the cheese coating turns a little brown.

Baked Veg is ready. You can serve as a starter or along with a toast in the main course.

That's what the little ones taught me.



सामग्री

- 1-आलू 3(बड़े उबले हुए)
- 2-अमूल चीज़ क्यूब-4
- 3-शिमला मिर्च 1(बारीक कटी हुई)
- 4-स्वीट कॉर्न -1/2कप
- 5-हरा धनिया- 3टेबल स्पून(बारीक कटा हुआ)
- 6-रेड चिली फ्लेक्स-½ टी स्पून
- 7-काली मिर्च पाउडर-1/2टी स्पून
- 7-फ्रेश ब्रेड क्रम्स-1कप
- 8-कॉर्न फ्लोर-6 टेबल स्पून
- 9-मैदा-3 टेबल स्पून
- 10-नमक-स्वादानुसार

विधि-

सर्वप्रथम आलू मैश कर लें। अब इसमें चीज़ कद्दूकस करके डालें, हरा धनिया, शिमला मिर्च, काली मिर्च पाउडर, रेड चिली फ्लेक्स, स्वीटकॉर्न, 3 टेबल स्पून कॉर्न फ्लोर, नमक थोड़ा कम ही डालें। सभी सामग्री को मिला कर अपने मनपसंद आकार के गोले बना लें।

इसके पश्चात एक छोटे बर्तन में 3 टेबल स्पून मैदा और 3 टेबल स्पून कॉर्न फ्लोर लेकर पानी डाल कर घोल बना लें। ध्यान रखें कि घोल न ज्यादा पतला हो न ज्यादा गाढ़ा।

अब गैस पर कढ़ाई में तेल गरम होने रखें। बने हुए गोलों को पहले घोल में डुबायें फिर ब्रेड क्रम्स में लपेट कर तल लें।

लीजिये तैयार हैं आपके अमूल चीज़ कॉर्न बॉल।



Zebra Cake

Ingredients

- 2 cups all-purpose flour (*maida*)
- 1 cup powdered sugar
- 2.5 tablespoons unsweetened cocoa powder
- 3/4 cup olive oil/ flavorless oil (you can also use melted butter or ghee at room temperature)
- 1½ cups milk or as required.
- 2 teaspoons baking powder
- 1 teaspoon baking soda
- 2 teaspoons vanilla essence (if using pure vanilla extract then 1 teaspoon is fine).
- Salt- a pinch

Procedure:

- Sift together the flour, sugar, and salt. Add oil, milk, baking powder and baking soda.
- Now comes the fun part. Divide the batter into two halves.
- Sift cocoa powder in one batch and mix it gently. Add a little milk.
- To the other half, add vanilla essence and mix.
- Take your baking tin and pour one spoon of vanilla batter in the center of the pan and allow it to spread naturally.
- Now take one spoon of chocolate batter and pour it in the center of the vanilla batter. The quantity will increase and the batter will spread more.
- Patience is the key while pouring alternate spoons of the two batters.
- Be cautious enough, not to be in a hurry or tilt the pan to spread the batter. Allow it to spread naturally.
- To create the design, take a toothpick and starting from the center of the batter make lines to the end of the batter.
- Once you have got all the lines from the center to the end of the tin, it is now time to draw lines in reverse i.e. from the end of the tin to center of the tin.
- Place it in the preheated oven at 180 degrees and bake for 40 to 45 minutes, till a toothpick inserted comes out clean.
- Place it on the cooling rack and enjoy the cake.


