



LET'S MAKE RECYCLED CRAYONS


Procedure :-

Melt the broken pieces of crayons with some sparkle dust in silicon cupcake moulds at 250 degree for 5-10 minutes.


Then, before solidifying, add a drop of essential oil/essence after taking them out of oven. Leave the moulds to cool. Take the crayons out and enjoy colouring.
