It is extremely important to consider academics and extracurriculars as two sides of the same coin and try to bring about the right balance between education and fun for our children.




My Friend – Jackal of the Forest


Did you know...



The Legendary Saranggarh Clock Tower with the Lily Pond in backdrop.

The Saranggarh Clock, one of Raipur's oldest clocks, is a key feature of Rajkumar College and can be found in the centre of the campus. Raja Shri Jawahir Singh ji of Saranggarh built it in 1918 and gave it to the school as a gift. The ancient clock dates back more than a century.

Battle tank T-55, a war trophy of the Indian Army, was gifted to Rajkumar College, Raipur (C.G.) by Defense Force. Designed by Soviet Russia and considered the best in their class then, the T-55 battle tanks played a key role in India's victory in the 1971 Indo-Pakistan war that led to creation of Bangladesh.
