MATHEMATICS PHOBIA- CAUSES AND SUGGESTED SOLUTIONS.

A one-day Maths workshop was held on 29th January'22 at Rajkumar College, Raipur on the topic: Mathematics Phobia-causes and its possible solutions. It was an in-house event which raised the important questions that are always persistent in every academic institution, *Why are students always apprehensive about 'Mathematics'?* The participants included all the faculty members who have been engaged in sharing their expertise in the field of Mathematics with the students, since many years , namely

It was an event that gave an opportunity to one and all to express their opinion and provide feasible solutions pertaining to the issues discussed , which were duly noted and directed for further deliberations. The main presentation was given by Mr. S.K Sengupta (Senior faculty -Department of Mathematics). The event received all possible guidance and motivation from the Management (RKC, Raipur), with active participation from Mr. Shivendra N.S. Deo (Vice Principal) and Ms. Seema Siddiqui.

The main reasons for students developing a phobia regarding Mathematics were identified as-

Mathematics is abstract in nature, so it requires concept building by individual learners.

1. Students let their doubts remain unsolved without trying to resolve them with the help of their teachers, mentors or peers.
2. Students have the habit of checking the solution to every numerical question that they solve.
3. If the answers do not match exactly as given in the answer key, it demotivates the students.
4. The students find it difficult to frame the statement problems into numerical form and as such it acts as a pitfall to solve the problem in the first place.
5. Mathematics is treated as a theoretical subject by many students and they read the solutions as a novel.
6. They keep practicing the problems based on a certain concept and formula, on which they have already gained expertise.

Suggested solutions to help students gain confidence to tackle the phobia regarding Mathematics-

1. 'Catch them young'. This applies for Mathematics also; it is imperative that the young minds are groomed in such a way that they develop an understanding and admiration for the subject.
2. Everyday examples from our daily lives and events should be used at this juncture to make the concepts clear.
3. It should be noted that every building requires a strong foundation, so it should be kept in mind that the knowledge expected to be gained in any academic year regarding Mathematics cannot be neglected or postponed.
4. Teachers being the facilitators, need to take upon themselves their responsibility in the right way.
5. They should keep in mind that every word that they utter in the class, has a long-lasting effect on the student.
6. As such use of words/language that may have a negative impact on the students like – this topic is very tough, most of the students fail in this subject etc, has to be totally eliminated.
7. The teacher should introduce the topic and elucidate in the best possible way and spend the maximum time in concept building.
8. A teacher should always bear in mind that the target audience in the class are always the slow learners. After all a horse can move at the pace of a horse, but the vise – versa is not possible.
9. Encourage the students to ask doubts and impress upon them to never shy away from making mistakes.
10. Encourage the students to learn the formulas, otherwise expected results cannot be achieved even if the concepts are clear.
11. The students need to be encouraged to try other methods, to reach the correct solution.

Impress upon the students that Mathematics is a subject that gives joy and has immense potential. Teach them easy mathematical tricks that will break the monotony of the class and also equip them with better tricks to handle calculation work. Learners can protect themselves against the development of mathematics anxiety by different means which includes developing a positive yet realistic self – concept driven attitude. Positive learning behavior, allocating enough study time and avoiding procrastination can go a long way in completely getting over this phobia.



ENGLISH WORKSHOP

The English Workshop on 29th January 2022, Saturday began with Mr.S.K.Mishra, informing the gathering about the supreme importance of Language for a strong foundation in English. It commenced with the five pillars of learning, namely, like Understanding, Listening, Speaking, Reading and Writing. It covered a whole gamut of topics that are taught under English Language classes. Since it was a session meant for English teachers from classes 6 to 12, it started with the Grammar items that are taught in Class 6 and concluded with the items required for Class 12. The highlight of this session on English I (Language) included some 'Do-it-yourself' exercises like, 'How to teach Composition?', E-mail writing and Notice writing. Exercises on Preposition, Phrasal Verbs and Active Passive were done to cover the syllabus of upto Class 10. While for Class 12, the participants were informed about Report Writing and Proposal Writing. In addition to this, some handouts were provided to the participants for further use in their respective classes like Self Analysis, Story Time (To teach Verbs), Positive, Negative Adjectives and Tricky Prepositions. The second part of the workshop started with Mrs. Shrabony Dey, explaining to the gathering about the importance of Literature. Dealing with Literature part of the workshop, she began with a bang with an anecdote when a Class 12 student has asked her 'Why to study Literature?' She concluded in one sentence that 'Literature is life!' In her session, Mrs. Dey covered the key points of English Literature, for junior as well as senior classes. By showing a video on the poem 'Daffodils' by William Wordsworth, she spoke at length about the importance of the setting of a poem and elaborated on the 'Lake District of England' and how it inspired Wordsworth to write one of the finest poems of English Literature! She also gave some insight into the story, 'The Little Match Girl' by Hans Christian Anderson. Moving on to the world of Shakespeare, she reiterated the need to understand the importance of imagery and literary devices, while teaching Literature. Her discussions covered the Shakespearean texts of 'The Merchant of Venice', 'The Tempest' and 'The Story of an Hour' by Kate Chopin. And she elaborated on how writers often use subtle ways to delve deep into characters, to make the readers feel one with them.

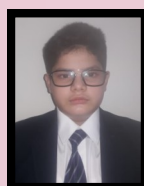

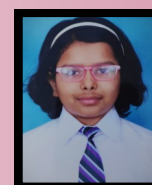

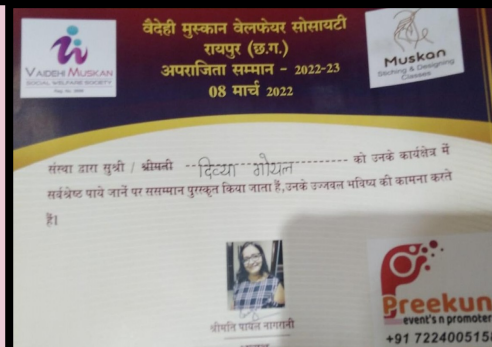
ICE CREAM PARTY
