



## EXCEPTIONAL SCHOOLS OF INDIA AWARD 2022



Rajkumar College, was awarded the prestigious Exceptional Schools of India Award 2022. The only one of its kind, it has earned a lot of name in the field of education. Our school team was flagged off ten minutes apart from the start point, which was Marine Drive to Anupam Garden and then back to the starting point. The event started around 5:30 am concluded around 9:30am. Higher Secondary School, Tilak Nagar, Gudhiyari was the proud winner of the event.

However, all the participants were given gold medals and a gift voucher to appreciate their efforts. It taught the students to perform as team and communicate. 


## *PRINCIPALS' CONCLAVE*


## INTER SET BADMINTON CHAMPIONSHIP
