I am made up of plastic, my friends are made up of wood, metal, and many other materials.



THE MONSOON MAGIC


The clouds come in, dark and wide,

It's monsoon time, a happy room.


Rainbows shine with colours bright,

Kyara Jain of Class III D got 1st position in National Level Classical Dance Competition.




