While this may seem like good parenting, it often weakens a child's ability to handle challenges in the future. When parents intervene too much—completing homework, resolving conflicts or protecting children from failure—they deprive them of essential problem-solving skills.

Children need to experience setbacks and difficulties to develop resilience, confidence and independence. If parents always step in, children become dependent on external help rather than learning to navigate obstacles themselves. They may struggle with decision-making, emotional regulation, and perseverance when faced with adversity later in life.

Moreover, constantly shielding children from disappointment can lead to unrealistic expectations. In the real world they will face challenges—rejections, failures and hardships that no parent can fix. If they haven't learned to cope with difficulties early on, they may become anxious, frustrated or incapable of handling stress.

To raise strong, self-sufficient individuals, parents should encourage problem-solving by guiding rather than fixing. Instead of providing immediate solutions, they can ask open-ended questions that help children think critically. Teaching them to face consequences, take responsibility and learn from failures will prepare them for adulthood. A supportive but non-interfering approach ensures children grow into resilient, capable and confident individuals ready for life's inevitable challenges.

Viaan Sundrani of class IV G proudly secured his first publication with Brick Book Publication.

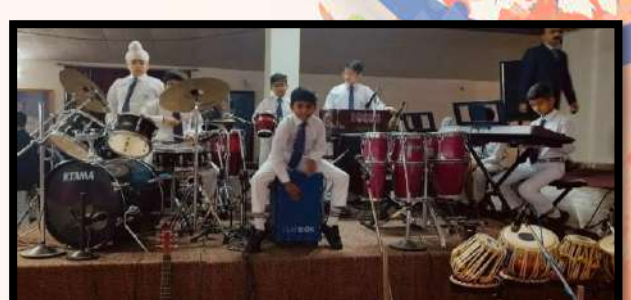
