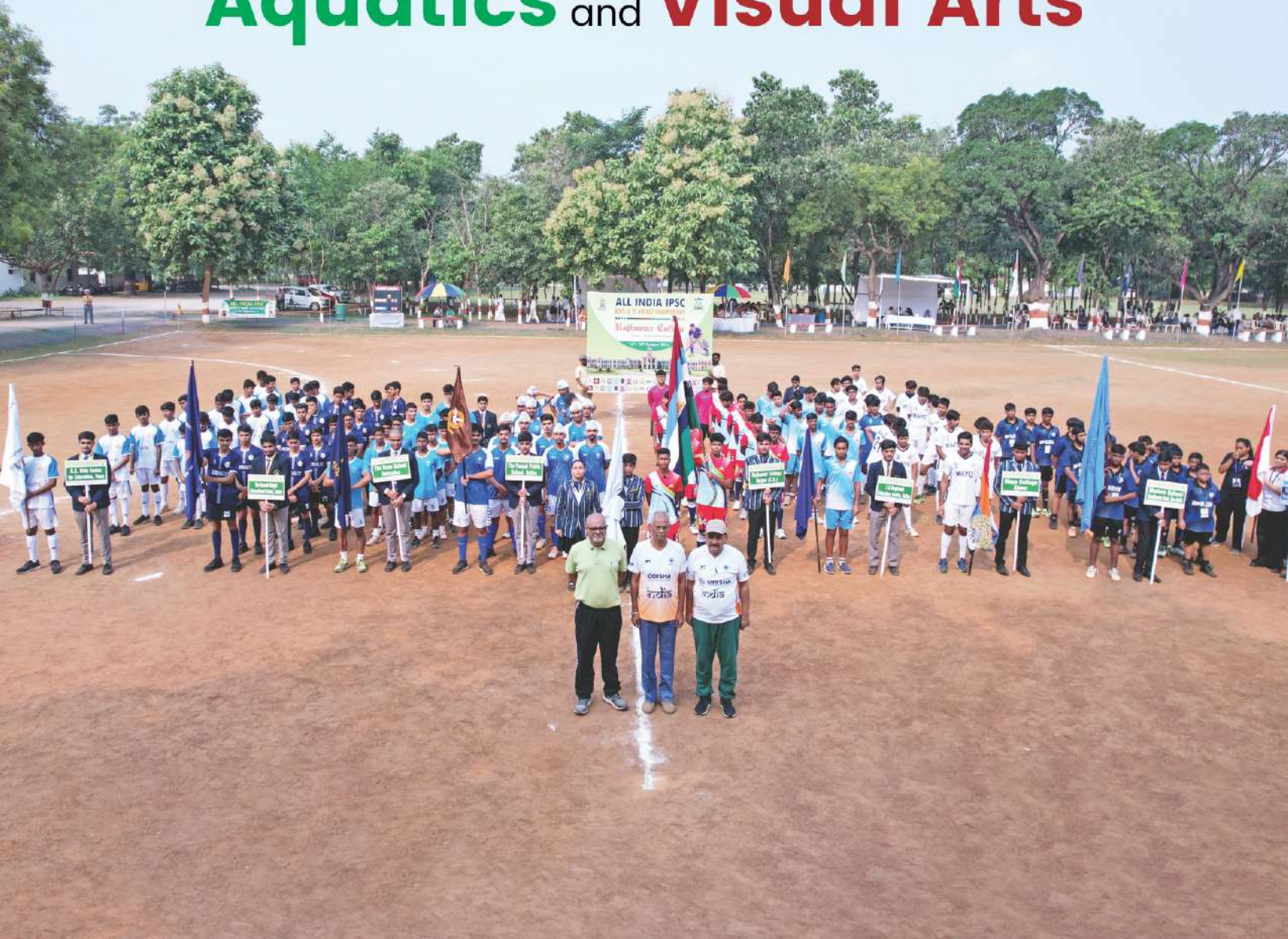

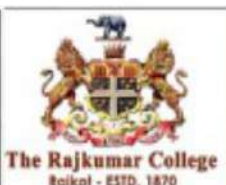

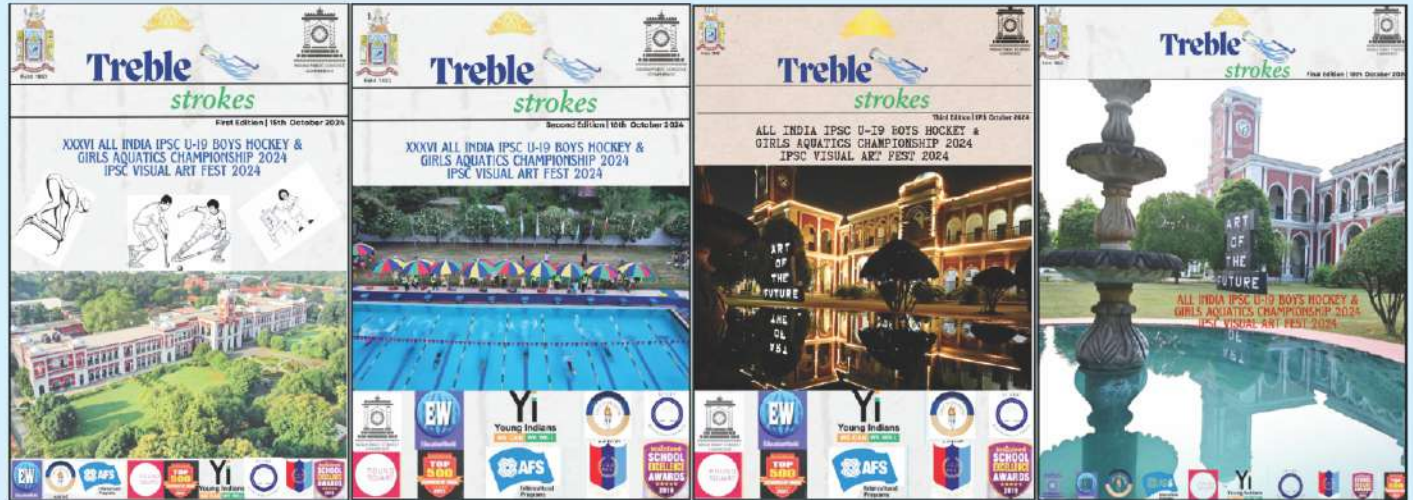


Glimpses of Art Fest
