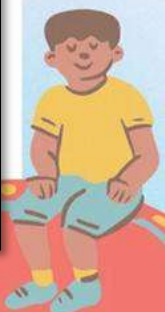

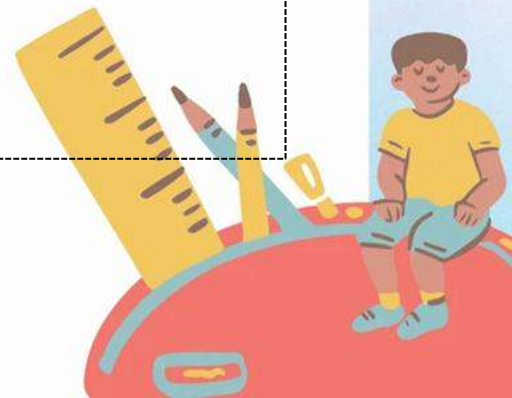
Magic Moments with my Pink Spectacles

and more.

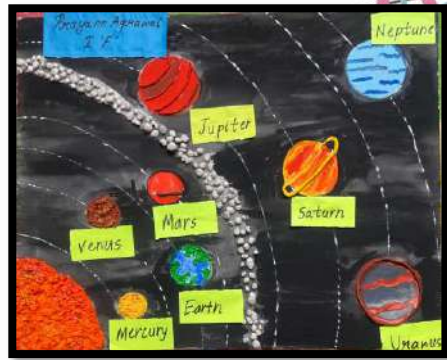
