RKC Mess Visit

Under the guidance of Mrs. Shraddha Singh Deo girls of PGBH visited the RKC mess.

Mess is divided into various sections including the washing area, cold storage, bakery, pantry and two separate kitchen one for vegetarian and another for non-vegetarian food.

Students were shown various machinery installed in the kitchen and were informed about their different uses.

Mr. Panda informed the students about the staffs and the daily food consumption.

He mentioned that there are around 75 workers including servers and chef, Moreover he told that the consumption includes 100-150 litres of milk, 65kg rice, 7-8 commercial cylinders per day. Breakfast is prepared for 700-800 people, 1800-2000 for lunch and dinner for 600-700 people.

Mess starts functioning from 3:30 AM with tea preparation and continues till 9:30 PM.

The students were highly impressed by the cleanliness of the mess. They learnt and explored various new things and even the staff members were very humble and kind.
