The event took place in a calm, respectful atmosphere, allowing participants to speak without pressure. It also served as an opportunity for students to observe their peers, learn new speaking techniques, and develop better communication skills. The experience benefited not only the speakers but also the anchors and the audience.

In conclusion, the Non-competitive Elocution was a meaningful initiative that provided students with a platform to grow beyond academics. It supported the development of public speaking, confidence, and clarity of thought — all of which are essential skills for the future.



## TEACHER ORIENTATION BY DR. SHROFF



An orientation program for teachers was held on 11th January, led by Dr. Manjula Shroff, an experienced educationist and trainer. The session focused on improving teaching methods, understanding student needs, and handling classroom challenges more effectively. Dr. Shroff emphasized the importance of adapting to changing student behavior and using practical, student-centered teaching strategies. Interactive discussions allowed teachers to share experiences and ask questions, making the session engaging and relevant. The orientation ended with key takeaways that teachers planned to apply in their classrooms. Overall, the session was informative and helpful, offering practical insights to support teachers in their daily responsibilities and professional development.


